GENERAL COORDINATOR'S ADDRESS:

THE HERITAGE OF CELESTIAL CHURCH OF CHRIST

(An excerpt from the book; "The Heritage of Celestial Church of Christ")

It is expedient that each of the youths present for this conference gets a copy of the book for better understanding of the lecture.

This declaration became the foundation upon which the entire history of redemption was built.

This book traces that remarkable journey from Eden to Calvary and beyond. It explores the theological significance of Christ's redemptive mission and examines the place of the Celestial Church of Christ within God's continuing purpose for His Church.

It further discusses the importance of spiritual education, revelation knowledge, prophetic ministry, prayer, holiness, and the Five-fold Ministry as essential instruments for building mature believers who reflect the image of Christ.

May every reader approach these pages with an open heart, allowing the Holy Spirit to illuminate the Scriptures and reveal the immeasurable riches of God's grace through Jesus Christ.

4. Display It Openly: Verses 8-9 speak of binding them as signs and writing them on our doorposts. Our heritage should be visible. Let people see Christ in our conduct, holiness in our dressing, and excellence in our service.

My charge to the youths: This generation has tools our fathers didn't have — social media, music, technology. Let's use them to spread our heritage, not hide it. Don't be ashamed of who you are. Don't water down the faith to fit in. Live it. Teach it. Display it.

Finally, as we go forth in this conference, let us go as carriers of our heritage — not just Celestial by name, but Celestial by life. May God help us to live our heritage in truth and in power.

2026 CONFERENCE RULES AND REGULATIONS

Halleluyah, you are warmly welcome to the 28th Annual Youth Conference. We thank God for granting us another opportunity to gather in His presence under the theme "**Living our Heritage**" (Deut 6:6-9, CCC Hymn 280).

As participants in this sacred gathering, every attendee is expected to conduct themselves in a manner worthy of Christ and the Celestial Church of Christ. These rules have been carefully prepared to ensure a peaceful, safe, spiritually enriching and successful conference experience for everyone.

Every participant is required to read, understand and strictly comply with the following rules and regulations throughout the conference according to 1 Corinthians 14:40.

1. REGISTRATION

1. Every participant must complete the official conference registration before given permission to enter the conference premises.
2. Registration materials, tags or wrist/hand-bands must be worn throughout the conference.
3. Participants should provide accurate personal information during registration.
4. Registration is non-transferable.

2. ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

1. Attendance at all worship sessions, Bible studies, lectures, seminars, workshops, and other scheduled activities is compulsory.
2. Participants are expected to arrive at every programme venue before the commencement time. Late coming, unnecessary movement, and absenteeism without permission are prohibited.

3. COMPLAINTS AND ENQUIRIES

1. All complaints should be reported through Parish, Area or State Coordinators while Coordinators shall communicate with the appropriate committee (Ask Me Committee or Conference Secretariat).
2. Participants should avoid spreading rumours or creating unnecessary panic.

4. SPIRITUAL CONDUCT

1. Every participant is expected to maintain a prayerful and reverent attitude throughout the conference.
2. Respect should be shown during worship, prayers, and ministrations.
3. Side discussions, noise-making, and unnecessary

movement during spiritual activities are prohibited.

4. Every participant should carry a Bible, notebook, and pen to every session.

5. TOBACCO, DRUGS, ALCOHOL AND OTHER PROHIBITED ITEMS

The possession or use of any of the following is strictly prohibited: Tobacco products, Cigarettes and vaping devices, Alcoholic beverages, Illegal drugs and narcotics, Contraceptives, Pornographic materials and Gambling materials, anyone found with these items shall face disciplinary action.

6. PROGRAMME SCHEDULE

1. The official conference timetable shall be strictly followed.
2. No participant should absent themselves from any programme without permission.
3. Participants shall remain seated throughout lectures except when permitted.
4. Respect all announcements made by conference officials.

7. SECURITY

1. Cooperate fully with the Security Committee.
2. Always wear your conference identification tag.
3. Report suspicious persons or activities immediately.
4. Do not admit unauthorized persons into restricted areas.

8. FIREARMS, FIREWORKS & DANGEROUS ITEMS

The following are strictly prohibited: Firearms, ammunition, fireworks, knives or dangerous weapons, explosive materials

9. CLEANLINESS AND ENVIRONMENTAL SANITATION

1. Keep the conference environment clean at all times.
2. Dispose of waste only in designated bins.
3. Toilets and bathrooms must be properly used and kept clean.
4. Participants should participate in environmental sanitation when required.
5. Do not vandalize conference facilities.

10. HEALTH AND MEDICAL CARE

1. Every illness, injury, or emergency should be reported immediately to the Medical Team.
2. Participants on medication should inform the Medical Committee upon arrival.
3. Self-medication is discouraged without proper



medical advice.

11. MOVEMENT AND LEAVING THE VENUE

1. Participants are expected to remain within the conference premises throughout the programme.
2. Leaving the venue requires written approval from the appropriate Coordinator.
3. Attendance in all programmes throughout the conference (Friday–Sunday) is mandatory.
4. Unauthorized absence may attract disciplinary measures.

12. CHRISTIAN CHARACTER

Participants shall demonstrate: Respect, humility, honesty, self-control, love, patience, obedience etc

The following are prohibited: Fighting, bullying, harassment, abusive language, gossip, intimidation, theft, dishonesty etc

13. DRESS CODE

1. Modest and decent dressing is compulsory.
2. Participants shall wear complete and properly maintained white garment.
3. Red and black apparel are prohibited.
4. Males shall not remove their shirts in public.
5. Transparent or revealing clothing is prohibited.
6. Excessive jewellery, makeup, artificial eyelashes, tattoos, and indecent hairstyles are prohibited.

14. RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN MALE AND FEMALE PARTICIPANTS

1. Males and Females should maintain godly relationships.
2. Private meetings in secluded areas are prohibited.
3. Public display of affection is prohibited.
4. Participants shall respect all restricted areas.

15. RESTRICTED AREAS

The following places are out of bounds unless officially authorized: Kitchen, Kitchen Lobby, Mercy Land, Hostel Areas, Luggage Rooms, Technical Control Rooms, Administrative Offices, Generator House

16. COOPERATION

Every participant shall cooperate fully with all the units/committee. Instructions from officials should be obeyed promptly.

17. MEALS

1. Meals shall be served only at designated times.
2. Meal tags shall be presented before collection.
3. Queue orderly and avoid pushing.
4. Wastage of food should be avoided.
5. Cooking by participants is prohibited.
6. Buying or selling during programme periods is prohibited.

18. PHONES AND ELECTRONIC GADGETS

1. Mobile phones should remain on silent mode during programmes.
2. Phone calls should not interrupt worship or lectures.
3. Charging devices is entirely at the owner's risk.
4. Bring power banks where possible.
5. Unauthorized photography or recording during ministrations is prohibited unless approved by the media unit.

19. LOST AND FOUND ITEMS

1. Lost items should be reported immediately.
2. Found items should be submitted to the Conference Secretariat.
3. The Conference Management shall not be responsible for valuables lost due to negligence.

20. ITEMS TO BRING

Every participant should come with: Bible, Notebook, Pens, Two pairs of Sutana, Toiletries, Toothbrush and toothpaste, Soap, Deodorant, Towel, Plates, Cup, Spoon, Water bottle, Nose mask (where required), Hand sanitizer, Torchlight, Power bank, Bedsheet and blanket.

21. DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

Violation of any conference rule may result in one or more of the following: Verbal warning, Written warning, Withdrawal of conference privileges, Community service within the conference, Monetary fine, Suspension from conference activities, Immediate termination of participation and return home, Notification of Parish, Area, State, and Parent/Guardian, Additional disciplinary action by the Church where necessary.

22. GENERAL CONDUCT

1. Be a worthy ambassador of Christ and the Celestial Church of Christ.
2. Respect fellow participants regardless of tribe, language, nationality, or background.
3. Avoid every form of discrimination.
4. Keep noise to the minimum, especially during rest hours.
5. Protect all conference property.
6. Maintain an atmosphere that promotes holiness, unity, peace, and love.

GOODLY HERITAGE

Text: Psalm 16:5-6

"The LORD is the portion of mine inheritance and of my cup: thou maintainest my lot. The lines are fallen unto me in pleasant places; yea, I have a goodly heritage."

INTRODUCTION

Many Christians are aware of God's promises but have little understanding of their inheritance in Christ.

An inheritance is not something you work for; it is something legally transferred to you because of your relationship with the giver.

Through the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, every believer has been brought into a divine inheritance that is rich, glorious, and eternal.

God does not want His children living as beggars when He has already made them heirs. The life of a believer is a life of divine inheritance. When God saved us through Jesus Christ, He did not merely forgive our sins; He brought us into a glorious inheritance. Many Christians struggle because they have not discovered who they are and what belongs to them in Christ.

A heritage is something passed down from one generation to another. In the natural world, people inherit properties, wealth, names, and positions from their parents. In the same way, every believer has inherited spiritual blessings from God through Christ Jesus.

As believers, we must come to the understanding that our lives are not products of chance, luck, or human efforts alone. We have been called into God's family and made heirs of His kingdom.

I. WHAT IS A GOODLY HERITAGE?

A. It Is God's Predetermined Blessing for His Children:

God planned your inheritance before the foundation of the world. Ephesians 1:3-5, Ephesians 1:11, 2 Timothy 1:9

God chose you before creation, your blessings are not accidental, God's plan for your life is glorious, your inheritance is already secured in Christ.

Illustration: A child born into a wealthy family does not struggle to become an heir; he is born into it. Likewise, believers are born into God's kingdom inheritance.

II. CHRIST IS THE FOUNDATION OF OUR HERITAGE

Hebrews 9:15, Galatians 3:13-14, Colossians 1:12

Jesus paid the full price for our inheritance, His death activated the New Testament, everything He purchased belongs to us, we are qualified to partake of the inheritance.

The Cross Purchased: Salvation, Righteousness, Divine health, Prosperity, Victory, Authority, Eternal life

Understanding Your Identity in Christ

One of Satan's greatest weapons is ignorance. He wants believers to remain unaware of their inheritance. Romans 8:17 declares: *"And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ."*

Think about this carefully. If you are a joint-heir with Christ, then everything that belongs to Christ belongs to you.

His victory becomes your victory. His authority becomes your authority. His righteousness becomes your righteousness. His peace becomes your peace.

Many Christians pray as beggars when they should be speaking as heirs. An heir does not beg for what legally belongs to him.

III. WHAT DOES OUR GOODLY HERITAGE INCLUDE?

A. Eternal Life - John 3:16, 1 John 5:11-13, John 10:10: Eternal life is the very nature of God imparted into the human spirit.

B. Divine Health - Isaiah 53:5, Matthew 8:17, 1 Peter 2:24: Healing belongs to the believer because Jesus paid for it.

C. Prosperity and Abundance 2 Cor. 8:9, Philippians 4:19, Psalm 35:27: Poverty is not part of God's inheritance package.

D. Dominion and Authority Luke 10:19, Mark 16:17-18, Ephesians 2:6: Believers have authority over Satan and the forces of darkness.

IV. WHY MANY BELIEVERS DO NOT ENJOY THEIR HERITAGE

A. Ignorance Hosea 4:6: People suffer because they do not know what belongs to them.

B. Unbelief Hebrews 4:2: Knowledge without faith produces no results.

C. Wrong Thinking Romans 12:2: Transformation begins with renewed thinking.

D. Failure to Act on God's Word James 1:22: Inheritance becomes reality through corresponding action.

V. HOW TO WALK IN YOUR GOODLY HERITAGE

1. Know the Word Acts 20:32: The Word builds you and delivers your inheritance. Many people fail, not because God has not blessed them, but because their minds are conditioned for failure. Romans 12:2 says: *"And be not*

Psalm 16:6 says, "The lines have fallen to me in pleasant places; indeed, I have a beautiful inheritance." That's you. That's me. You were born with a heritage, and you were reborn with a better one.

1. Your heritage is God-given, not an accident

God placed you in your family, your tribe, your nation for a reason. Acts 17:26 says He determined the times and places we should live. That means your name, your language, your skin, your story — all of it is intentional. As an actress, I used to think I had to hide my accent or background to get roles. But God reminded me: He doesn't make mistakes. Don't apologize for what God designed. Your culture is a pulpit. Use it to preach excellence.

2. Build it on the foundation of Christ

Heritage without Christ is just history. But heritage built on Jesus becomes legacy. Matthew 7:24-25 talks about building on the rock. That's character. That's integrity. That's saying "no" when everyone else says "yes" because you fear God more than you fear missing out. Whatever career you choose — tech, fashion, ministry, art like me — build it so that when storms come, your name still stands. Build a heritage your grandchildren can inherit without shame.

3. Maximize it for Kingdom impact

Don't just keep your heritage in a box. Multiply it. Daniel and his friends were in Babylon, but they didn't lose their identity. They used their skill, their wisdom, and their faith to influence a whole empire. Youths, you're in Babylon too — social media, schools, streets. Use your talent to show Christ. If you sing, sing for His glory. If you code, solve problems for His people. If you act, tell stories that heal, not destroy. Maximize your heritage by making it serve God's purpose.

4. Protect it with holiness

Heritage is not just what you have. It's what you hand down. 2 Timothy 1:5 talks about the sincere faith that lived in Timothy's grandmother Lois and mother Eunice, and now in him. That's generational transfer. Protect your name. Guard your heart. Flee youthful lusts like 2 Timothy 2:22 says. Because one mistake can erase 20 years of building. The world will test you, but remember: you carry a royal heritage. 1 Peter 2:9 — "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood." Act like it.

Final Charge:

Youths, you are not just the leaders of tomorrow. You are the custodians of today. Maximize what God gave you. Build on it with wisdom, skill, and holiness.

One day, someone will point to your life and say, "Because of you, I now know what a godly heritage looks like."

- B. **By Discipline in Love:** Training, correction, and boundaries show that God's ways are better than the world's ways.
- C. **By Stories of God's Faithfulness:** Tell your children and younger ones how God

delivered you, healed you, or provided. Testimonies become their faith.

- D. **By Investing in the Spirit:** Take them to programs like AYC, Bible class and the likes. A saved soul is the richest asset you can hand over.

Why It Matters in 2026

The world is offering a different "heritage": phones, trends, money rituals, and shortcuts. If we don't give our children a godly anchor, the world will give them a godless one. A godly heritage protects them from moral collapse, gives them purpose beyond money, and ensures the work of God continues after us. CCC Youth Organisation, Nigeria Region exists partly to guard and grow this heritage in the next generation of sons and daughters of Zion.

What Will You Be Remembered For?

Years from now, will your children remember your house, or will they remember your prayers at 12am? Will they remember your car, or your counsel from the Bible? Will they remember your money, or your commitment to God's work?

Gold and silver can be stolen. Certificates can be forgotten. But a godly heritage lasts for generations. It is the best gift any parent, guardian, mentor, or leader can give. But fame is not the same as good character.
Before choosing someone as your role model, ask yourself:

Does this person honour God?

Does this person's lifestyle encourage me to live a holy life?

Will following this person's example bring me closer to Christ?

If the answer is no, then that person is not the right role model.

The Bible says,
"Bad company corrupts good character." (1 Corinthians 15:33)
Choose your friends wisely.
Choose your influences wisely.

MANAGING EMOTIONS

L/S/P AYANTEJU AYANDELE(JP)

INTRODUCTION

Emotions are natural and unavoidable, our response to them determines whether they become a source of strength or a source of distress. I have observed that many emotional crises are not caused solely by life events but by difficulty understanding, expressing, and regulating emotions effectively.

Managing our emotions is a skill, some people learn to manage their emotions in childhood by watching how their parents or caregivers manage their own difficult emotions. But what happens if our caregivers didn't have healthy strategies to manage their feelings, or if we didn't have a consistent person to teach us?

- * Define emotions.
- * Explain the relationship between emotions and mental health.
- * Emotional regulation and emotional intelligence.
- * Component of Emotional intelligence
- * Consequences of Poor Emotional Management
- * Describe healthy emotional management strategies.
- * Understand when professional intervention is necessary.

WHAT ARE EMOTIONS?

Emotions are complex psychological and physiological responses to internal or external experiences.

They involve three components:

1. Subjective Experience; This is how we personally feel. Examples include: Happiness, Fear, Sadness, Anger, Excitement.
2. Physiological Response; Every emotion affects the body, which include:
 - a) Fear; increased heart rate, Sweating, Rapid breathing
 - b) Anger: Muscle tension, Elevated blood pressure, Adrenaline release.
 - c) Trembling, Dry mouth, Nausea, Palpitations

These changes are mediated by the autonomic nervous system and stress hormones such as adrenaline and cortisol.

3. Behavioral Response; Emotions influence behaviour. Examples include:
Joy → Smiling
Fear → Avoidance
Anger → Confrontation
Sadness → Withdrawal

WHY DO WE HAVE EMOTIONS?

Emotions serve important adaptive functions.

They help us:

- * Recognize danger.
- * Make decisions.

- * Build relationships.
- * Learn from experiences.
- * Protect ourselves.
- * Communicate needs.
- * Develop empathy.

For example:

Fear prepares us to respond to threats.

Sadness encourages reflection and seeking support.

Anger alerts us to injustice or violated boundaries.

Joy reinforces positive experiences.

Therefore, emotions are not enemies; they are information.

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN EMOTIONS AND MENTAL HEALTH

Emotions and mental health are closely interconnected. Emotions are a natural part of human life and serve as internal signals that help us respond to our environment. Mental health, on the other hand, refers to a person's emotional, psychological, and social well-being, influencing how they think, feel, and behave.

The relationship between emotions and mental health is bidirectional:

Our emotions influence our mental health.

Our mental health influences how we experience, interpret, and regulate our emotions.

How does Emotions affect mental health

1. Emotions Influence Thoughts

Our emotions affect the way we think and interpret situations. For example, a student who feels anxious before an examination may think: "I am going to fail." or "I am not good enough." These negative thoughts increase anxiety, creating a cycle that affects concentration and performance. Positive emotions, on the other hand, encourage optimism, confidence, and problem.

2. Emotions Influence Behaviour

People often behave according to how they feel. For example, they shout when they are angry, self isolate when they are sad, smile when they are happy and joyous.

3. Emotions Affect Physical Health

Mental and physical health are closely connected. Strong emotions activate the body's stress response. During stress:

- Adrenaline increases.
- Cortisol is released.
- Heart rate rises.
- Blood pressure increases.
- Muscles become tense.

How Mental Health Influences Emotions

The relationship also works in the opposite direction.

Mental health conditions often change the way people experience and regulate emotions.

Depression

Individuals with depression may experience:

- * Persistent sadness
- * Hopelessness
- * Irritability
- * Emotional numbness
- * Loss of pleasure in previously enjoyable activities.

Even positive events may fail to improve their mood.

Bipolar Disorder

People with bipolar disorder experience marked changes in mood and energy, including:

Manic episodes

- * Elevated mood
- * Increased energy
- * Reduced need for sleep
- * Impulsivity

Depressive episodes

- * Low mood
- * Fatigue
- * Hopelessness

When emotions are recognized, understood, and managed effectively, they promote psychological well-being. However, when emotions are intense, persistent, or poorly regulated, they can contribute to emotional distress and the development or worsening of mental health conditions. Emotions influence mental health and mental health also influence emotions

EMOTIONAL REGULATION

Emotional regulation refers to the ability to monitor, understand, and modify emotional reactions appropriately according to the demands of different situations.

It does not mean suppressing emotions, it means expressing emotions in ways that are healthy, appropriate, and constructive. It is also the bridge between emotions and mental health.

EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

According to psychologist Daniel Goleman, emotional intelligence consists of five components:

1. Self-awareness

The ability to recognize, understand, and accurately identify your own emotions, thoughts, strengths, weaknesses, values, and the impact they have on your behaviour and on others. It is the foundation of emotional intelligence because you cannot effectively manage emotions that you do not recognize. Some of the characteristics of a self-aware person are:

- Recognizing emotions as they occur.
- Understanding emotional triggers.
- Acknowledges strengths and weaknesses.
- Accepts constructive criticism.
- Demonstrates confidence without arrogance.
- Reflects on personal behaviour.

2. Self-regulation (Self Management)

The ability to control, manage, and express emotions appropriately rather than reacting impulsively. It involves choosing a thoughtful response instead of an automatic emotional reaction. Self-regulation does not mean suppressing emotions. It means expressing them in healthy and constructive ways.

3. Motivation

The internal drive to achieve goals, remain committed, and

persevere despite setbacks. Emotionally intelligent people are motivated by personal values, purpose, and growth rather than external rewards alone.

To be motivated, you need to;

- Set realistic goals.
- Maintain optimism and show resilience
- Persevere during challenges.
- Be disciplined.
- Maintain a growth mindset.
- Learn from mistakes.
- Surround yourself with positive influences.

4. Empathy

The ability to recognize, understand, and appreciate another person's emotions and perspective. Empathy involves placing yourself in another person's position without losing your own objectivity.

5. Social Skills (Relationship Management)

The ability to establish, maintain, and manage healthy interpersonal relationships through effective communication, cooperation, conflict resolution, and leadership. Characteristics of Individuals with good social skills:

- * Communicate clearly.
- * Listen actively.
- * Work well in teams.
- * Build trust.
- * Resolve conflicts peacefully.
- * Demonstrate leadership
- * Influence others positively.

CONCLUSION

Managing emotions is not about eliminating feelings; it is about understanding them, accepting them, and responding to them in healthy and constructive ways. When emotions are intense, frequent, persistent, difficult to control they increase vulnerability to mental health disorders.

God created us with emotions, even the scriptures says in Prov 4: 23 'above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. Managing your emotions doesn't mean you are hiding it or pretending. Emotions are not your identity, God sees every tear and understands every fear and invites us to bring every emotion to Him.

Some people lose opportunities because of uncontrolled anger, some destroy relationship because they never learned how to communicate hurt, some people battle anxiety in silence because they believe asking for help is a sign of weakness, some smile outwardly while carrying overwhelming emotional pain.

God is not asking us to suppress our emotions but He is inviting us to surrender them to Him.

BIBLE STUDY MANUAL: LIVING OUR HERITAGE

Theme Text: Deuteronomy 6:6-9 | CCC Hymn 280

Other Texts: Psalm 16:6, Colossians 1:12, 1 Peter 2:9, Colossians 1:15-20, Hebrews 1:1-4, John 14:6-11, Matthew 11:28-30

Sub-theme (Day One):

Understanding our heritage in Christ & Jesus
Christ: The full expression of our Heritage

Learning Objectives

At the end of this study, participants should be able to:

1. Define heritage from a biblical perspective.
2. Distinguish between spiritual heritage and mere religious tradition.
3. Understand that Jesus Christ is the source and fulfilment of our heritage.
4. Recognize the believer's responsibility to preserve and transmit God's heritage to future generations.
5. Commit themselves to living as faithful custodians of God's heritage.
6. Understand that Jesus Christ is the center and substance of the believer's heritage.
7. Explain why every aspect of Christian life finds its fulfilment in Christ.
8. Recognize that Christianity is fundamentally about following a Person rather than merely observing religious practices.
9. Identify how Christ shapes our identity, worship, service, and mission.
10. Commit to living a Christ-centered life that faithfully expresses our heritage.

Introduction

The word heritage often brings to mind family property, ancestral customs, or cultural traditions handed down from one generation to another. While these ideas have value, the Bible presents heritage in a much deeper and more enduring way.

Biblical heritage is not merely what we inherit from our earthly ancestors; it is what God graciously gives to His covenant people. It is the divine life, truth, identity, promises, and responsibility entrusted to believers through Jesus Christ.

David understood this reality when he declared: "The lines are fallen unto me in pleasant places; yea, I have a goodly heritage." (Psalm 16:6)

David was not celebrating material possessions but rejoicing in God's covenant favour and allotted

portion.

The Apostle Paul later expands this understanding by reminding believers that God has qualified them to become partakers of "*the inheritance of the saints in light*" (Colossians 1:12). This means that every believer in Christ has already received a spiritual inheritance, not by human effort, but by divine grace.

Our challenge today is not whether we possess this heritage, but whether we are faithfully living it.

What is Heritage?

In Scripture, heritage refers to a divinely received inheritance that establishes identity, relationship, purpose, and responsibility within God's covenant.

Heritage is not simply something owned; it is something lived.

It shapes:

Who we are, what we believe, how we worship, how we relate to God, how we influence the next generation. Therefore, heritage is both a privilege and a responsibility.

Word Study from the Bible

Hebrew: Nachalah (נַחֲלָה)

Meaning: inheritance, possession, allotted portion or permanent possession received by covenant
Throughout the Old Testament, this word frequently describes the inheritance God gave Israel, not merely land, but covenant identity and divine relationship.

Greek: Kleronomia (κληρονομία)

Meaning: inheritance, heirship, allotted possession or legal inheritance. The New Testament uses this word to describe everything believers receive through Christ, including eternal life, adoption, salvation, and participation in God's Kingdom.

Having established the meaning of the root word "Heritage", this means that our heritage is covenantal, spiritual, and eternal.

And this we must not forget that "Heritage" is more than tradition, because one of the greatest dangers



facing every generation is confusing heritage with tradition.

- a. Tradition preserves customs.
Heritage preserves life.
- b. Tradition may preserve forms.
Heritage preserves truth.
- c. Tradition can exist without transformation.
Heritage always produces transformation.

Jesus Himself warned against elevating human traditions above God's commands (see Mark 7:8-13). Therefore, the Church must constantly distinguish between practices that honour God's truth and traditions that merely satisfy human preferences.

The Foundation of Our Heritage

Every Christian heritage rests upon three unchanging foundations:

1. Jesus Christ
2. The Word of God
3. The Holy Spirit

Our Heritage Produces Certain Expressions

Because Christ lives in us, our heritage becomes visible through our daily lives.

Among these expressions are:
Worship and reverence for God.
Love for God and neighbour.
Prayer and intercession.
Evangelism and missions.
Obedience to God's Word.
Dependence on the Holy Spirit.
Holy living.
Fellowship with believers.

These are not the heritage itself but the evidence that God's heritage is alive within us.

Living Our Heritage in the Celestial Church of Christ

Every Christian tradition expresses biblical truth in particular ways. Within the Celestial Church of Christ, our heritage includes a rich legacy of reverent worship, fervent prayer and intercession, prophetic sensitivity under the authority of Scripture, disciplined worship, evangelism, and the singing of Celestial Hymns. These practices are precious because they are intended to point us to

Christ and encourage obedience to God's Word.

We must therefore treasure these expressions without confusing them with the foundation of our faith. Our true heritage is God's saving work in Christ, made alive in us by the Holy Spirit and governed by the Scriptures. When these foundations remain central, our worship and traditions retain their spiritual significance.

Jesus Christ: The Full Expression of our Heritage

Many people define Christianity by what Christians do, attending church, praying, singing hymns, serving in ministry, or keeping traditions. While these practices are valuable, they are not the foundation of our faith. The Christian faith is centred on a Person: Jesus Christ.

God has not merely given us principles to follow; He has given us His Son. Every spiritual blessing, every covenant promise, every gift of grace, and every hope of glory is found in Him.

Therefore, to understand our heritage, we must first understand Christ, because He is both the Giver and the Full Expression of our inheritance.

As Jesus Himself declared: "Learn of Me..." (Matthew 11:29). He did not say, "Learn a system," "Learn traditions," or "Learn rituals." He called His disciples to know and follow Him. Hence;

1. Jesus Is the Revelation of God's Heritage (Hebrews 1:1-3)
2. Jesus Is the Source of Our Salvation (Ephesians 1:7, Colossians 1:12-14)
3. Jesus Is the Model of Kingdom Living
4. Jesus Is the Fulfilment of the Scriptures
5. Jesus Gives Meaning to Every Expression of Our Heritage

Many practices are valuable in the Christian life, but they derive their meaning from Christ.

- a. **Worship:** We worship because Christ has reconciled us to God.
- b. **Prayer:** We pray because Christ has given us access to the Father.
- c. **The Word:** We study Scripture because it reveals Christ.
- d. **The Holy Spirit:** The Spirit glorifies Christ and forms His character in us.
- e. **Love:** We love because Christ first loved us.
- f. **Evangelism:** We preach Christ, not ourselves. Without Christ, these activities become empty religious exercises.



6. Jesus Is the Standard for Every Generation (Hebrews 13:8)

Christ and Our Heritage in the Celestial Church of Christ

The Celestial Church of Christ has received precious expressions of worship and devotion, including fervent prayer and intercession, disciplined worship, prophetic ministry under biblical authority, evangelistic zeal, and the rich ministry of Celestial Hymns. These are valuable gifts that have strengthened generations of believers.

However, these expressions find their true purpose only when they continually point us to Jesus Christ. If Christ is removed from the centre, even the most beautiful traditions lose their spiritual power. But when Christ remains central, these expressions become living testimonies of God's grace and instruments for building His Church.

Our calling, therefore, is not merely to preserve forms, but to preserve a Christ-centred faith that glorifies God and transforms lives.

Do this:

Learn Christ before learning methods.
Love Christ more than traditions.
Obey Christ above personal opinions.
Reflect Christ in your daily conduct.
Lead others to Christ through your words and actions.
Ensure that every ministry and expression of worship points people back to Him.

Conclusion

- Heritage is not something we merely inherit; it is something we faithfully preserve, intentionally practice, and carefully transmit.
- Every generation stands as a steward of what it has received from God.
- The question before us is not whether we have a heritage. The question is whether the next generation will receive it intact because we chose to live it faithfully.
- Jesus Christ is not merely one part of our heritage; He is its source, substance, and supreme expression. Everything we have received from God is found in Him, and everything we pass on to future generations must lead them to Him.
- To live our heritage is, therefore, to live Christ daily, in our worship, our character, our relationships, our service, and our witness to

the world.

Discussion Questions

- What is the difference between heritage and tradition?
- Why must Christ remain the center of our heritage?
- In what practical ways can young believers preserve God's heritage?
- How can the Church ensure that future generations receive this heritage intact?
- Why is Jesus Christ described as the full expression of our heritage?
- What dangers arise when Christians focus more on traditions than on Christ?
- How do worship, prayer, the Word, and evangelism point us to Christ?
- In what practical ways can young believers keep Christ at the center of their lives and ministries?
- How can the Church preserve its unique expressions of worship while ensuring that Christ remains the foundation

- Thank God for making us partakers of His heavenly inheritance through Christ.
- Thank God for revealing Himself fully through Jesus Christ.
- Pray for grace to faithfully live and preserve our heritage.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to keep us rooted in God's Word and truth.
- Pray that God will raise a generation that will faithfully transmit His heritage to the nations.
- Pray for grace to know Christ more deeply and follow Him faithfully.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to keep Christ at the center of your life, worship, and service.
- Pray that the Annual Youth Conference will produce a generation that reflects Christ in character, ministry, and mission.
- Pray for the grace to preserve and transmit a Christ-centered heritage to future generations.

The Revival

AWAKE GATEKEEPERS & WATCHMEN (ISAIAH 62:6-7)
